

# Download E.m. Forster: A Study

Edward Morgan Forster OM CH (1 January 1879 – 7 June 1970) was an English novelist, short story writer, essayist and librettist. Many of his novels examined class difference and hypocrisy, including *A Room with a View* (1908), *Howards End* (1910) and *A Passage to India* (1924). E. M. Forster (1879-1970), noted English author wrote *Howards End* (1910); The words that were read aloud on Sunday to him and to other respectable men were the words that had once kindled the souls of St. Catherine and St. Francis into a white-hot hatred of the carnal. Forster, E. M. (Edward Morgan Forster), 1879–1970, English author, one of the most important British novelists of the 20th cent. After graduating from Cambridge, Forster lived in Italy and Greece. *Howards End* seeks to address the question of which class will prevail and define England's future. As a technique for exploring that question symbolically, Forster presents *Howards End* as a symbol of England, with its rural past and its more urban future, its quintessential English-ness, and its role in the lives of most of the main characters.
